There's a hate advisory for August! And the target is our court system.

Whether violent Leftist thugs are terrorizing US Supreme Court Justices at their homes or in restaurants, the Left's intentions are intimidation, chaos, disruption, and destruction. Conservative jurists are their targets, but Justice Clarence Thomas is a special target since he is a black Republican. Reports are that an impeachment petition with 1,200,00 names

is calling for Thomas' removal.

Here in NC, the Left's target is our own NC Supreme Court race, which the University of Virginia's Center for Politics ranks as the top judicial race in the nation. Expect a 'high stakes, high-dollar, rough-and-tumble battle' for ultimate control of our State's highest court.

Dale Folwell, NC's State Treasurer, just announced that \$200,000,000 has been added to the unclaimed property fund. Yes, that's 200 MILLION more dollars! During the last 12 months (7/2021 to 6/2022), Folwell's office distributed \$105,000,000 to individuals and organizations that had money owed to them from things like closed

bank accounts, safe deposit boxes, or refunds never claimed.

The unclaimed property fund now totals \$1.02 billion, and Secretary Folwell wants to return that money to its rightful owners. A new streamlined process to claim funds is online.
