Energy Conservation Program: Energy Conservation Standards for Consumer Water Heaters

Deadline to comment: September 26, 2023

Now I'm not saying that the Feds want to ruin our lives, but their cash-flow model is called "Government Regulatory Impact Model ("GRIM"), and GRIM says it all.

Just like "improved" toilets that don't flush, washing machines that don't clean, dishwashers that run for hours, the Feds now propose better water heaters.

The Feds admit that some people may have to forgo basic necessities and keep their homes at unhealthy temperatures. They admit that rebates will be necessary for people to afford the "improved" heaters. One point the Feds made is that homeowners bear the full cost of replacing the heater, unlike renters. Do they believe that a landlord does not pass on costs to the tenants by raising rent?

Reminder to all NCFRW clubs:

Be kind to your Treasurer and make her life easier by properly reporting transactions. Failure to follow State Board of Elections rules WILL result in hefty fines.

- Total cash donations cannot exceed \$50 per day from an individual donor.
- Donations over \$50 must be made by credit card OR by check from a private, personal account.
- Ensure that all transactions, whether merchandise or raffle tickets of any amount, even as little as one cent, are recorded with information that the Board of Elections requires, and that your Treasurer must report - the purchaser's name and address, county, employer and employment.
